Hats off and a round of applause go to all who contributed to the Cottey College Ohio Suite Endowment Fund! To fully fund the \$45,000.00 endowment, we needed to raise \$8,234.00. As of November 30, 2017, we have met and surpassed that goal by a few hundred dollars. Thank you for your support and generosity.

True to our theme, "P.E.O...a Sky Full of Stars!", Cottey College continues to shine bright! Each September, *U.S. News & World Report* publishes its rankings of Best Colleges and Universities. This year, Cottey is ranked #7 among 2018 Best Colleges in the Midwest Region and #3 for Schools with the Largest Proportion of International Students. Cottey is now ranked #2 in the Midwest Region for Lowest Student Debt Load at Graduation and the #2 Best Value School. This latest ranking is based on academic quality and net cost of attendance.

In late October, Cottey College announced that the Joan K. Bradshaw Scholarship would be awarded to Nicole Penick from Clifton, Tennessee. Cottey's Summer Workshop program for rising juniors and rising seniors is an exciting opportunity that offers students insight into leadership, skill development, and college and career preparation while showcasing everything Cottey has to offer for their future education. In addition to the toolbox of skills that each participant will take home, all

students who choose to enroll at Cottey College will be awarded a \$12,000 scholarship for her years at Cottey – that's an automatic \$3,000 annual scholarship! This year's workshop is scheduled for June 17-22, 2018. Registration will open on January 1 with a May 31 deadline. You may find more information at cottey.edu/workshop.

Educational Loan Fund

Did you know that our oldest P.E.O. philanthropy is the P.E.O. Educational Loan Fund? This loan was established in 1907 and has loaned over \$188,000,000 to over 47,000 women. This is an amazing memorial to our Founders that we have been able to financially assist so many women to attain their educational goals.

While many young women are seeking scholarships and grants to help defray the cost of a higher education, this loan can also meet the needs of many. If your chapter isn't talking to women about ELF, it is time to start. It is also worth knowing that a chapter can recommend more than one applicant per year for this loan.

Some highlights of the Educational Loan Fund:

• The maximum loan amount is \$12,000 for associate and bachelor degree programs, \$15,000 for master's degrees, and \$20,000 for doctoral-level degrees.

- A woman is eligible to receive consideration for an ELF loan if she is recommended by a local chapter of the P.E.O. Sisterhood along with other requirements.
- The current rate of interest is 2 percent.

A student must have and maintain the scholastic average required for graduation by the school she attends. A current transcript is required as evidence of satisfactory academic standing before an installment of a loan may be drawn. Reports of academic progress may be required for each note.

All applicants for the ELF program must be sponsored by a local P.E.O. chapter.

Our P.E.O. projects provide a wonderful springboard for women needing financial assistance to help achieve their educational goals. Don't forget to keep ELF in mind when presenting information to potential applicants.

A new online PCE application managed through Community Force went live in June. The application progress icon, the auto-save, and the ability to reopen the recommendation/application for corrections are new features that are beneficial to the local chapter PCE chairmen.

While I am available to answer any questions you may have, I would encourage all PCE chairmen to access the quarterly PCEnews, as well as any of the archived PCEnews, posted on the International website for helpful information on navigating the application process, finding applicants, and celebrating recipients in the column entitled, "Bright Spot."

Since March 1, 2017, eighteen Ohio chapters have sponsored 20 recipients in the amount of \$44,800! YOU are making a difference! To see how P.E.O.,

and especially PCE, has made a difference in the life of one Ohio woman, consider the life of LaTonya Jackson. LaTonya received a PCE grant in 2011, was initiated into Chapter DV, Ashtabula, in 2014 and shared her story at our Ohio state convention in 2016. From there she spoke at the 2017 Convention of International Chapter. Please watch and share the video of her compelling speech, found on the opening page of the P.E.O. International website. Let's continue to add women like this to our *Sky Full of Stars* who need assistance after an interruption of at least 24 months somewhere in her adult education, and are within 24 months of receiving a degree. They might even make a great sister one day!

Amendments and Recommendations

Chapter Presidents, Recording Secretaries, and Bylaws Committee Members,

Remember that all chapters' bylaws, standing rules and chapter policies are due by March 10, 2018, to Kylie Smith, OSC Vice President. If you haven't done so already, now is the time to check your chapter bylaws, standing rules and chapter policies against the following:

- Read through the 2017 Review of Chapter Bylaws and Standing Rules and cover letter mailed to your chapter president last summer and implement the suggested changes and recommendations.
- Use the Suggested Bylaws posted on the Ohio P.E.O. Website as a guide as well as The Style Guide (found on the P.E.O. International website). Both are excellent resources.

Once the recommended changes have been made:

- Report the changes that were made to the chapter's bylaws at the next business meeting.
 The new date on the bylaws is the date of the meeting at which you are reporting.
- If you are adding or making changes to your bylaws, standing rules, or policies other than what A&R has recommended, be sure to follow the procedure found in Article V (or VI) of your chapter bylaws.

• The recording secretary then attaches the new bylaws to the minutes of the meeting at which they are read and gives a copy to the president for the President's Book. The recording secretary replaces the previous bylaws in the front of the Recording Secretary's Book. If the chapter's yearbook contains the bylaws, be sure that the vearbook committee has a current copy.

• Please highlight all changes made to your bylaws before submitting them. Various forms of highlighting include the use of a highlighter, different ink color, italics, bold or underlining. If no changes were made, please indicate that at the top of the document.

Your chapter bylaws, standing rules, and chapter policies (even if no changes were made) are due to Kylie Smith, OSC Vice President, by **March 10**, **2018**. Please email your bylaws as a Word document (kyliesmith1978@gmail.com). However, mailed copies will be accepted. If you have any questions, please contact us.
