#### **Historian's Notes**

Ninety-two years ago, the nine (9) chapters that existed in our state at that time, gathered in Loveland, Ohio, for the Ohio Convocation. It was there -- in the home



of John W. & Bessie Lee -- surrounded by delegates and visiting P.E.O. dignitaries, that the Ohio State Chapter of the P.E.O. Sisterhood was organized.

Here's how Chapter A's 1927 Secretary, Edith M. Brock, described the setting: On Monday afternoon, September 5th, Chapter A of Ohio P.E.O. met at the home of Mrs. Julia Coleman to welcome to Convocation the delegates and sisters arriving from the other chapters (8) throughout the State. Greetings and introductions were followed by registration at the desk where Mrs. Louise Vandervort presided and where she presented each member with a white and yellow badge bearing their name, and a Convocation program. Her daughter, Mildred, had charge of the punch bowl and sent all away refreshed. Shortly after two o'clock the local members and their guests motored out to the Mrs. Bessie Lee's beautiful country home to the opening session of the Convocation. It was later that afternoon that Mrs. Julia Coleman, State Organizer, moved that a State Chapter be formed. The rest, as they say, is history.

P.E.O. created our very own world-changing scholarship with the conception of the International Peace Scholarship (IPS) in 1949. IPS was created to help women from around the world achieve their educational goals with the aim to return home with their advanced degrees and use their education to make the world a better place.

How can you help change the world? Share more about IPS with your local chapter and community:

- Spread the Word! Share IPS information and requirements with local universities that offer advanced degrees
- Take a Minute! The P.E.O. International website shares the experiences of scholarship recipients every other month. It takes "only a minute" to share this with your local chapter at meetings and

it's so exciting and humbling to hear what these young women have to say.

- Moments for Peace! Also available on the website, a document of names and bios of our scholarship recipients. This gives more information and background, in addition to some words from some of the women. This document is added annually.
- Partners in Peace! Lastly, YOU can become a Partner in Peace. A minimum donation of \$500 to the IPS Fund and completed Partners in Peace form (found on the International website) should be submitted by March 1st. Your local chapter will be matched with an IPS recipient that you can get to know a little better.

# Scholar Awards

"Women Helping Women Reach for the Stars." That tagline certainly describes P.E.O. in general and is especially appropriate for the P.E.O. Scholar Awards (PSA). These highly competitive, merit-based awards are given to women reaching for that ultimate of stars, a doctoral level degree.

Earlier this year it was announced that in celebration of P.E.O.'s 150th anniversary, awards of \$15,000 would be given to 150 very deserving women. Of those, six went to women nominated by Ohio chapters. It's time to continue this process for 2020 awards!

Eligibility requirements are easily found on the P.E.O. website and include the applicant being a U.S. citizen and within two years of her graduation at an accredited college or university. Chapters submit an on-line nomination and a chapter letter between August 20 and November 20. The nominee then completes her part of the application and awards will be announced by May 1, 2020.

#### SWING INTO 2020 WITH THE STAR!

Go find your candidate now! When interviewing her, refer to the questions which replace the chapter's letter of recommendation. They are posted on the P.E.O. International website STAR project page under TEXT BOX QUESTIONS. Formulate interview questions using them to illuminate your applicant's brilliance to the selection committee. The on-line application is open September 1st to midnight November 1st for your chapter to start the process. Your applicant has 30 days from the day her confirmation email is sent from International to complete the application process. Remember, you CANNOT use Microsoft Edge or Explorer web browsers to do the application. I am here for you and will gladly talk you through the on-line process! Additionally, please ask your chapter's applicant to email you a digital portrait head and shoulder shot or take your own. Try to put together a brief bio with

Keep your eyes and ears open for an outstanding candidate. Ask around. There are definitely women in Ohio who would benefit from some financial assistance as they reach for their own personal stars.

Local chapters can reach for their own stars by achieving Laureate Chapter designation. If a chapter successfully nominates a PSA recipient, the Chapter automatically becomes a Laureate Chapter for that year. Any chapter making a lump sum contribution of at least \$500 to the P.E.O. Scholar Awards by January 31 to the Ohio State Treasurer also earns this designation and will be paired with one of the PSA award recipients. It's a wonderful way to get to know one of these outstanding women and offer her P.E.O. love and support through correspondence, phone calls, or visits. Make the Scholar Awards personal for your chapter by earning the Laureate Chapter recognition. Perhaps make it a goal of your fund-raising efforts this year.

Remember that our Ohio President, Marty Billing, has chosen SWING INTO 2020 WITH THE STAR! as her theme for this year. Let's swing into 2020 with even more P.E.O. Scholar Award recipients from Ohio and more chapters earning the Laureate Chapter designation.
