- 4. Share the remaining articles with the chapter as soon as possible at subsequent meetings and/or electronically. The Heartline should be kept in the President's file box for one year.




Dear Sisters,

Educational Loan Fund

For my article this month, I turned to *The P.E.O. Record* to see what information I could glean from the ELF Loans article. Wow, it is just the information I want to share.

When we think of candidates for ELF loans, we typically think of women who are working toward a bachelor's, master's or doctorate degree. Well, at least I do. Don't forget to think about women who are working toward an associate degree or women that are in a non-degree accredited program. While this demographic may not be front of mind, there are many women who begin to further their education through this type of academic curricula. These degrees and programs are often more cost effective. They also allow a faster track to employment and can be a springboard toward an advanced degree.

The maximum loan amounts for a non-degree accredited program and associate degree is \$12,000. All applicants must submit the ELF application 6-24 months prior to graduation or course completion date. It is important that you begin the application process right away with the candidate as most programs are less than a 2-year duration.

Take the time to read the ELF Loan article in the January-February 2019 issue of *The P.E.O. Record* and get more information about how you can help women to reach for the stars.

P.E.O. International Peace Scholarship

2019 marks the 70th anniversary for P.E.O.'s International Peace Scholarship Fund (IPS). IPS was created to support international women studying in the United States or Canada with plans to return home with advanced degrees. Thank you, Ohio chapter sisters for *Lighting tomorrow with today* through your support of IPS. Ohio had 30 PIP awards that are shared by 13 students studying throughout the United States from abroad.

To become a PIP chapter you must make a \$500 donation and complete the "Partners in Peace Form" (found on the international website under IPS). IPS Board of Trustees (one of which is our very own Jan Knuckey) will match your chapter with an IPS recipient with whom you can form a special bond. Donations must be received in the P.E.O. Executive Office before the March 1 deadline. Chapters are notified of their IPS student in September.

The P.E.O. Partners in Peace Named Scholarship is a gift of at least \$12,500 from an individual, a chapter

or group of chapters, or a state/provincial/district chapter (also due by the March 1 deadline). The donation pays for the entire scholarship for an IPS recipient.

Please encourage your local chapter IPS chairmen to access the international website regularly. The bimonthly *Take a Minute for IPS* and *Moments for Peace* provide up to date information that can be shared at local meetings and offer an opportunity to learn more about the recipients from around the world who are benefiting from the International Peace Scholarship Fund.

In closing, I welcome chapter stories about the relationships you have developed with your IPS students. Please email your chapter stories, photos, etc. so that I can include them in the Projects Room display at Ohio State Convention May 31-June 1.

There are always a lot of questions about P.E.O.'s policies regarding Circularization - the use of P.E.O.'s mailing lists and directories. Please take time to check out the revised section in the Instructions to Officers of Local Chapters (IOLC) regarding Circularization. After careful review of current Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations, changes have been made to the approval process:

 Local chapter fundraising mailers/email within the boundaries of a state, provincial or district chapter NO LONGER require s/p/d board approval for circularization

- Fundraising across s/p/d lines **STILL** requires approval of the Executive Board of International Chapter to assure that we are in compliance with the IRS guidelines
- Local chapters must still follow all Fundraising Guidelines in the IOLC

A new webpage with all of the Circularization information in one place has been designed at peointernational.org in Resource Library, Local Chapter Members. A privacy policy has been included in the Circularization Policy and is published in reference to using P.E.O. member contact information.
