Will you be my Valentine?

Do you remember when you were younger, and you folded a sheet of paper in half to cut out a heart? Then you may have embellished the red heart by gluing it onto a doily. Lastly you wrote the phrase "Will you be my Valentine?" on your creation. What happened next? That special acknowledgement of your sentiments was given to someone you cared about.

In P.E.O. we care about each of our sisters. The friendships we share are the foundation of our Sisterhood and date back to the very beginning of our organization. When Brenda Atchison chose as her biennial theme Build Your Legacy, Make History, she was asking us to take action. We were asked to add on to what our Founders envisioned – loving each other with a grace that forgives misunderstandings and embraces our commonalities.

When you look at the last word of Brenda's theme – History – you find the word 'story' embedded in it. The dictionary defines 'story' as a narration of the events in the life of a person. Do you know the 'story' of your chapter sisters?

As we get to know our sisters and learn their stories, we share our own stories too. This builds the common bond we share.

You may have participated in a networking activity where a ball of yarn is tossed from one person to another in a circle. Our connections and our stories are what constitute the fabric of our shared Sisterhood. Will you connect with one of your sisters this month of Valentine's Day and share your loving concern for her?
