## **Scholar Awards**

When Nancy Shelton chose "Dream and Take Flight" as her theme this year, I wonder if she was thinking of Jessica Meir, a 2008 Scholar recipient. She was part of the first all-female spacewalk in 2019 as she spent 205 days on the International Space Station. It seems very appropriate that P.E.O. had extended a helping hand to Jessica in the pursuit of her doctoral degree. That is what the Scholar Award is all about—recognizing and honoring women of excellence.

This year there were 847 nominations submitted for the Scholar Awards. One of the questions I am asked most often is, "How do we find deserving young women to nominate?" Begin by making use of any chapter connections with area campus personnel. They might have suggestions about who to contact in specific graduate departments. Even if your chapter doesn't have any personal connection, contact deans or department chairs in area universities, inform them about PSA and ask for referrals to their top women doctoral candidates.

If your chapter doesn't happen to be located near any college or university with a graduate program, you can still look for candidates among your extended family members, friends, or co-workers. It is not a requirement that a possible nominee by an Ohio chapter be enrolled in an Ohio school.



Even though most of us want to put 2020 behind us, 20/20/20 still has relevance for the Scholar Awards. Nominations are accepted between August 20 and November 20 and the award amount is \$20,000. It is not too early to begin your search for worthy candidates!

If your chapter is having trouble finding women to nominate for the PSA, help your chapter stay connected to this program by using some of the outstanding information on the P.E.O. International website. There are interesting biographies of Scholar recipients that could be presented as reports at chapter meetings. Especially check out Shaonta Allen, a 2020-2021 recipient who will be the PSA speaker at our virtual convention, June 4-5.

Unfortunately, we are seeing an increase in the number of chapters struggling with membership issues. Last year, the Membership and Leadership Committees of International Chapter collaborated to create an initiative titled *Chapter Vitality Coach*. "Sara was thrilled to receive a call, and wants to attend a meeting with our chapter."


"Judy is interested in attending our Zoom meetings."

The PCE Grant was established in 1973 and since it began, \$62,400,000 has been awarded to 49,700 women. Those are big numbers, but there is so much more we can do.

The National Student Clearinghouse Research Center reports that since 1993 the number of Americans with Some College, No Degree (SCND) but with 2 years completion is approximately 3.5 million. Ohio is one of the top 10 states with SCND's and since 54% of that population are women, our pool of potential recipients is huge.

So-how do we find them? Or how do they find us? Everything is electronic these days. You can search:

"Top 10 Most Popular Scholarships for Women"

"Best Grants and Scholarships for Women"

"Scholarships for Women Returning to College" and all of these sites list the PCE Grant. The P.E.O. International website has the "Potential PCE Grant Candidate" form available to anyone who is interested in pursuing a PCE grant but candidates need to be able to find it.

What occurred to me while doing this research is how time consuming and often confusing it is. However, we do have an under-utilized resource, and that resource is you. P.E.O. sisters are the greatest source of information for helping women find PCE! Think of friends, family, neighbors, co-workers, students or perhaps just an offhand comment by someone about a woman returning to school.

Let's get on board and raise that 49,700 number. For those chapters who have successfully sponsored a PCE recipient, let us hear your success stories. Sharing in the success of others can be a real boost and a valuable goal for those working hard to complete a degree or certificate. 
ELF has had a long and glorious history since its official inception in 1907.

Chapter O, St. Louis, MO, wanted to hold a P.E.O. Day at the St. Louis Exposition of 1904. They requested that each United States chapter contribute a mere ten cents per member to help with the event expenses. The P.E.O. Day was so successful it earned \$658.88 after expenses, and that was the beginning of our current Educational Loan Fund. At the 1907 Convention, the idea of a scholarship for women was blazed into policy. The first loan of \$300 was granted in the spring of 1908.

There have been times during its history that ELF applicants were few: the Great Depression, World War II and the pandemic COVID-19. After World War II, there was a surge of applicants and by 1952, ELF had granted its 10,000th loan. And, ELF is seeing greater participation since last summer, as curricula, educational institutions, and prospective students have adapted to the pandemic.

Ohio has played a role in ELF's success. There have been 1,474 ELF loans approved for Ohio chapters since 1907 for a total of \$5,532,754. And, as of the end of June 2020, P.E.O. International reported a grand total of \$223.2 million loaned. That is impressive, is it not?


